# FAQs: Professional Development Hours (PDHs) at SaSS KC

#### 1. What file type will I receive after purchasing a PDH?

All PDH materials are provided in a **Zip file containing an .mp4 video file**. If your computer does not support .mp4 files, you can easily **convert it to a .mov file** using free online converters to play it in **QuickTime** or other media players.

#### 2. What is the difference between a PDH and an ASHA CEU?

- A **PDH (Professional Development Hour)** is a unit of measure for professional learning activities that qualify toward maintaining your ASHA certification.
- An ASHA CEU (Continuing Education Unit) is tracked and approved by ASHA's CE Registry.
- Choosing PDHs allows us to keep your costs lower by avoiding ASHA's rising fees for CEU providers.

## 3. Will my PDHs automatically upload to ASHA's CEU Registry?

No, PDHs are **not automatically reported** to ASHA. Participants are responsible for **documenting and tracking their own hours** according to ASHA's certification maintenance standards.

#### 4. How do I document my participation in a PDH course?

You will receive a **completion certificate** after finishing your course. Keep this certificate and add it to your personal records for reporting during your certification renewal.

## 5. Can I use PDHs toward my state license renewal?

Every state has its own requirements for license renewal. Please check with your **state licensure board** to determine whether PDHs qualify for credit in your area.
